

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

Work experience will help prepare you for your future working life and the next steps you will take after school. You will have plenty of opportunity to use the skills you will gain whilst on your placement. The best way to get the most out of your experience is to prepare well.

Use this guide to get a good idea of what roles and sectors you are interested in (we have included all the roles into which we are able to place students). Research some companies in which you might like to be placed. Self-placement forms are ideal if you know exactly what type of role you are aiming for and within a certain company.

Work experience aims to give you a taste of real working life. It isn't all glitz and glamour. There are limitations to what employers are allowed to let you do. You may be asked to carry out a task multiple times. If your placement isn't what you expected, there is still a lot of value in the process and the skills you will learn.

Covid-19 has had an affect on many businesses in various different ways. Many had to adapt to working from home and others had to close completely for several months. Other businesses have had to downsize and some even shut down due to lack of income. Because of this, we have had to make some new recommendations on the best way to secure a placement within certain sectors.

SELF PLACEMENTS

A self-placement is where you approach an employer yourself to secure a work experience placement.

This is a fantastic way to ensure you get a placement in your chosen sector and job role. Many students choose to do this as they already have companies in mind of where they would like to do their placement. It's also a great way to build your confidence and show initiative to your employer.

Since the covid-19 pandemic began we have found that certain industries have become a lot more difficult to find work experience placements in, which is why to avoid disappointment we highly recommend you find a placement yourself with a company of your choice.

For industries that have very limited availability, you will see:

SELF PLACEMENT ADVISED



Write a cover letter to hand in with your selfplacement form, outlining why you want experience there and what skills you can bring to the placement. Calling or emailing your potential employer is always a safe option if you aren't sure on their current visitor policy.

Research the company before hand- what they do, who their customers are and what the company ethos is.

If you don't know any employees at the company, try and find the manager or somebody in HR.

TOP TIPS!

Choosing your placement based only on your future career goals may limit what you could learn. Think broadly about the skills you want to develop!



Working hours for students (max 37 per week) and lunch breaks are clearly stated on student confirmation paperwork.

Employers prefer that you attend a preplacement interview, depending on situations a telephone call may suffice. It will be down to you to make contact with your employer to organise this.

Consider how you will get to your placement when you complete the travel area section of your application.

Don't forget to check bus routes if that is how you will be getting to your placement.

Self-placements are the best option if you know exactly what type of sector you are interested in.

SHOW OFF YOUR SKILLS!



As well as qualifications, employers also look for the skills people have when they're applying for jobs. Here are some of the attributes that employers are most looking for and how to highlight them



Speak calmly and make eye contact with your employer.

Answer questions 'fully', not just 'yes' or 'no'. If you've done a presentation at school, explain how you presented it clearly and what the impact was.

open to different tasks and
ideas in the workplace.



Make sure you are on time every day. Ring into work if you're unwell (but not just a headache) to let them know you won't be coming in.



Use examples of how you contributed as part of a team. Your hobbies will show how you can get on with others. Explain how you listened, discussed and negotiated as part of a team to complete a task.



Show examples of how you've adapted to change. Make it clear that you're willing to learn new skills.



Dealing with the public involves a range of skills and qualities. Show that you understand the need to communicate well and can remain calm in difficult situations.





Explain how you would identify a problem and how you would solve it. Try to come up with different ways of tackling it and who else you would need to involve. If you can think of something you've had to resolve that was difficult then it shows that you're not afraid of a challenge



Work can sometimes be challenging, and your employer wants to know how you cope with set backs. Think of a time when you bounced back from difficult times.



You will be given the choice of many different sectors to choose from. We ask that when you are completing your work experience application form that you pick 2 or 3 options from section one and a maximum of 1 option from section two.

Skills and Expectations

If you have good communication skills and an aptitude for numeracy this might be the sector for you. You will get the chance to experience a professional working environment, this will involve meeting new people and working alongside them. You will be given instructions and occasionally the opportunity to work independently.

Administration Assistant - Good availability

Possible tasks:

- General administration tasks (word processing, photo copying, filing, faxing and emailing)
- Dealing with the post
- Using the telephone
- Invoicing and ordering
- Assisting with computer input, e.g. text, handle data, conduct research or produce graphics
- Assisting in the handling of routine enquiries and provision of information as required
- General accountancy work
- Observing meetings
- Work shadowing administration staff and supporting staff as required
- Visiting clients/suppliers
- Greeting customers

Clerical Legal Assistant - Limited availability Self placement advised

- Assisting in the reception
- General administration work (pre/post trial admin, inputting data, filing and photocopying)
- Assisting with preparation and dispatch of jury summons
- Possibly attending court where deemed appropriate
- Attending session with court probation team
- Collecting and delivering files to other offices locally
- Undertaking general customer service tasks

Junior Clerk / Accounts Assistant - Limited availability Self placement advised

Possible tasks:

- General administration tasks (word processing, photocopying, filing, faxing, emailing)
- Checking invoices have been calculated correctly
- Matching delivery notes with purchase invoices
- Greeting customers

- Checking incomplete records
- Analysis of bank receipts, payments and reconciliations
- Some opportunity to observe qualified staff at work
- Visiting clients
- General customer service tasks

Travel Assistant - Limited Availability - Self Placement Advised

- General administration tasks (photocopying, filing, use of database)
- Maintaining display brochures
- Checking window information and displays
- Conducting online research e.g. popular holiday destinations

- Stamping brochures
- Ticket work
- Greeting customers
- Customer service
- Work shadowing skilled staff

Business, professional and financial services cover a very broad range of activities – including finance, pensions, insurance, digital and IT services, accountancy, legal services, architecture, creative, research, design, scientific, and consultancy, and a range of support roles such as business administration and customer service. Companies in this sector welcome young people with high motivation, enthusiasm and strong communication skills. Roles require high commitment and hard work but can result in high job satisfaction and good pay! Many jobs rely on the expertise of staff to win clients, so good interpersonal skills are key. There are 78,900 people employed across 12,845 businesses in this sector locally

Key employers based here include Berkeley Insurance, BHIB, Santander, Mattioli Woods and Hastings Direct.

Specialist roles in the sector require formal qualifications and specific skills, such as lawyer, accountant or financial adviser and once you have completed your degree or apprenticeship, you will need to study further in your role.

In other roles employers are willing to recruit and train people 'on the job' if they have good customer focused skills, resilience and flexibility.

Legal businesses like Freeths, Gateley, Howes Percival and Shakespeare Martineau have offices here.

During lockdown much of the sector was able to adapt and offer an online service, with some areas like HR and employment law booming as businesses sought advice about furlough.

The Leicester Client Innovation Centre is IBM's first in the UK, with a range of opportunities for young people.

Cyber security, risk management, legal services, data protection, and environmental consultancy are thriving areas. Modern languages are in demand as global markets grow.





ENGINEERING & MANUFACTURING



Skills and Expectations

This is a good choice of sector if you enjoy working with machines and working practically. The roles below will suit you best if you thrive in a hands-on environment. Many of these roles will involve measuring things accurately and with confidence. These jobs may also involve working in a noisy, possibly dusty, dirty and sometimes cold environment, however other roles involve complete cleanliness.

Electrical / Electronics Assistant Limited Availability - Self Placement Advised

Possible tasks:

- Observing the design of systems (CAD)
- Using computer systems in the development of circuit designs
- Soldering circuit boards
- Testing and assembling subassemblies

- Compiling material, component parts and lists
- Shadowing a skilled technician
- Visiting customers with staff to discuss technical requirements or to repair equipment
- Assisting at on-site installations

Car Mechanic Assistant Good Availability - High demand

Possible Tasks:

- Work shadowing a skilled technician
- Assisting with fitting and replacing tyres and exhaust systems
- Servicing (changing / checking oil, filters, water levels, tyre pressures, fan belts, driver controls etc.)
- Assisting with pre MOT checks and MOT testing
- Handling electronic monitoring equipment (diagnostic tests)

Factory Operative Limited for pre 16 students - Self Placement Advised

Possible tasks:

- Observe various machining operations
- Calibrating various instruments used to do checks
- Work shadowing engineers
- Learning about programming CNC machines
- Assisting with the operation of CNC machines
- Learning about and using CAD/CAM machines
- Assisting with the operation of CMM equipment

Laboratory Assistant Limited Availability - Self Placement Advised

- Learner may be given a specific project to do
- Testing equipment to ensure it functions correctly
- Documenting results and analysing data

- Work shadowing skilled technicians
- Selecting preparing and testing samples
- Helping with instrument calibrations

Engineering and manufacturing is a dynamic, varied sector to work in, with lots of scope to progress. Engineering involves the use of scientific and practical knowledge to invent, design, and construct everything around us! Manufacturing is the production of goods from raw materials into finished goods. Advanced technology is used to improve processes and give companies a competitive edge. Many different products are made in Leicester and Leicestershire, from precision tools, electricals, motorbikes, packaging and bricks, and the area has a strong manufacturing heritage. Businesses include Caterpillar (construction machinery), Sofidel UK (tissue paper), Morningside Pharmaceuticals Ltd, SPS Technologies (aerospace components), and Hammonds Furniture. Manufacturing makes up 16% of the East Midlands economy. Young people are needed to become the engineers and manufacturers of tomorrow.

81,300 people are employed across 5,015 businesses locally in this sector. Careers are broad and can involve research, testing, developing prototypes, engineering and maintenance.

There are roles into manufacturing at all levels; some production line or packaging roles need few or no qualifications. There are engineering and manufacturing apprenticeships at different levels and graduate schemes too. If you work hard and show initiative you can progress.

Roles in demand include electrical, mechanical and artificial intelligence engineers, production managers and engineers, 3D printing technician, process operators, design engineers and machine programmers

The sector will increasingly rely on technical, STEM-based skills – to operate advanced and digitised machinery and processes – and softer and interpersonal skills, alongside management aptitude – to manage complex supply chains.

MIRA Technology Park (Hinckley) is the largest automotive research and development park in Europe, with an on-site skills and training centre. £41.2m of Government funding is going to REE Automotive, at its Engineering Centre of Excellence at MIRA, to support long-range electronic vehicle technology.

ENVIRONMENT & LAND-BASED STUDIES



Skills and Expectations

Are you interested in working with animals or in a rural environment, if so this may be the sector for you. You will often have to work outside, in all types of weather. Some of these roles may be physically demanding so being fit and healthy is ideal.

Farm Assistant - Placements Available - Must be willing to travel

Possible tasks:

- Assisting with the daily care and health checks of livestock
- Providing water, assisting with food preparation and feeding
- Work shadowing / assisting with general tasks as directed
- Assisting with milking and monitoring milk yields and quotas
- Assisting with general maintenance
- Assisting with moving stock
- Work shadowing office staff

Vet's Assistant - Limited Availability - Self Placement Advised

Possible tasks:

- Assisting with the daily care and health checks of the animals
- Providing water and assisting with food preparation for animals
- Assisting the staff with the care of animals which are being treated
- Cleaning and sterilising instruments and consulting rooms
- Assisting with general clerical duties (reception duties, greet clients and record keeping)
- Some opportunity to work shadow skilled staff

Animal Care Assistant - Limited Availability - Self Placement Advised

Possible tasks:

- Assisting with daily care and health checks of the animals
- Grooming
- General maintenance, cleaning and tidying of kennels, cages, runs, tanks and exercise areas
- Exercising the animals either in exercise areas or taking out for walks under supervision
- Learner may observe behavioural assessments and socialisation sessions with some animals

Equestrian/Farrier Assistant - Placements available - Must be willing to travel

- Assisting with the daily care and health checks of the horses
- Muck out and bedding down and making up hay-nets
- Providing water and assisting, with food preparation and feeding under preparation
- Grooming
- Leading horses for turning out or bringing in from paddocks
- Assisting with lesson preparation (setting up equipment/jumps)
- Some opportunity to observe the farrier or vet

Parks & Gardens Assistant - Placements available - Must be willing to travel

- Watering and feeding plants as instructed
- Assisting with ground maintenance
- sheds and štočk areas
- Laying turf

- Erecting and fixing fences
- Planting trees and hedges
- Work shadowing a skilled landscaper
- Clearing and replanting flower beds
 General tidying around equipment

 - Litter picking and general cleaning and tidying

Farmers and horticultural growers provide us with our food, including fruit, vegetables, pulses, grain, flour, meat and fish.. The forestry industry grows and harvests trees for wood and the horticultural nursery industry grow the plants that we keep in our homes, gardens and that are planted in our towns and cities. As well as producing our food, they also take care of much of our natural world.

Workers on our land are the custodians of our outdoor scenery. They care for the very environment that makes our country distinct and special; both in cities and in the countryside. They are custodians of our national parks, nature reserves, urban parks, lakes, rivers, forests, local green spaces, sports pitches and ornamental gardens.

Many people with a passion for animals find a rewarding career within land based working in conservation, zoos, pet trade, veterinary clinics and animal rescue charities. The equine industry is huge in the UK, both as a sports and amateur riding. There is a range of careers including farriers, grooms, jockeys, breeders and trainers.

Approximately just 10% of the UK landscape is built on and although much of this remaining 90% of land is used for agriculture and food production, it can all be classed as our 'countryside'.

There are many equine charities that require a number of employees who not only care for the horses but also have an understanding of the process of rehabilitation. Other Horse Careers include Equine Dentist and Equine Veterinary Nurse.

With over one hundred million people visiting zoos every year, zoo workers have an excellent opportunity to educate large numbers of people about the need for the conservation of wildlife and the importance of respecting animals. This responsibility assures a varied, interesting and rewarding career.

Dogs are highly social animals. Many cultures consider dogs to be a member of the family or a man's best friend. There are many different careers and job opportunities that allow people to work directly with dogs.

EDUCATION, TRAINING & CHILDCARE

Skills and Expectations

To get the very best from these job roles you need to enjoy working with children. Being caring and patient will be essential when working with young people. You will be working as part of a team so communication skills are needed too.

Nursery / Creche / Playgroup Assistant Good Availability

Possible tasks:

- Helping to prepare activities and materials
- Working with staff to lead activities
- Assisting staff with the social integration and interaction of the children
- Inputting ideas for children's games
- Helping supervise at break/play times
- Helping with general administration

- Assisting with snacks/drinks
- Helping at meal times
- Promoting hygiene awareness
- Tidying rooms after use
- Assisting with IT
- Planning and preparing specific activities

Teacher's / Classroom Assistant Good availability

- General observation
- Working with staff to prepare work and help with lessons
- Helping to prepare activities and materials
- Assisting staff with the social integration and interaction of the children
- Assisting with reading, number work, storytelling, artwork and practical activities
- Helping supervise at break times (during these times learners must not play with children unless specifically instructed to do so)
- Assisting with IT
- Tidying rooms after use
- Working with staff to prepare work
- Assisting with classroom support
- Learner may attend morning briefings
- Assisting with extra curricular activities

Education is an important large area of employment for the area, with 54,337 people employed. Most educational institutions moved to online teaching under lockdowns, with staff needing to master new software to deliver online lessons. This can be extremely rewarding work as you see your students succeed! Numerous opportunities in Leicester and Leicestershire link to the many schools, academies, colleges and three large universities. There are also several training providers here, and local authority offers that provide teaching or learning support roles. 7.3% of advertised roles* locally are in the education and training sector. There is a growing use of technology to teach, which is beneficial as it mirrors real working life, as most jobs across industries require employees to have technology skills of varying degrees.

The area has three excellent universities, with their own renowned specialisms, and a strong further education (FE) offer, plus many good local schools and academies. Career progression opportunities are good.

There is a shortage of teachers for specific subjects such as maths, technology, physics, chemistry, history and design technology. Bursaries are available for some subjects.

E-learning boomed under lockdown. This means more opportunities to design and develop content, marketing and e-product user support.

For many jobs you need a degree but some roles can be entered at a lower qualifications level and there are support roles too, for example admissions officer or school lunchtime supervisor.

The range of apprenticeships to access roles in the sector is increasing.

Roles include secondary education teachers, teaching assistants, adult tutors, English as a foreign language (EFL) teacher, primary and nursery education teachers, adult education and senior education professionals.

There is a shortage of male teachers in early years, primary and secondary education.



HAIR AND BEAUTY





Skills and Expectations

Jobs within this sector require you to work well within a team in a busy environment. A large part of this role will be working closely with customers and clients, so being friendly and confident is important. Due to the nature of this sector you will need to be neat and tidy.

Hair Stylist / Barber / Beauty Assistant Self placements advised for beauty placements

- General reception work (greeting customers, observation on appointment booking and telephone work)
- Preparing drinks for customers
- Observation of a skilled hairdresser/barber
- Shampooing
- Cleaning the salon

- Tidying shelves, stock and maintaining displays
- Setting up treatment rooms
- Cleaning equipment
- Observing treatments (with client consent)
- Using till after training and if appropriate

Hairdressing is a hugely rewarding career; it's sociable and creative, and since hair stylists are always in demand, it's an industry full of employment opportunities too. In fact, hairdressers are the happiest workers in the UK, according to City & Guilds. You can't teach affability and a willingness to learn – these are the fundamental skills that any prospective hairdresser needs just to get started. On top of that, you'll need to learn the technical skills – like cutting, colouring and styling hair – that are associated with the job.

This career gives you freedom of choosing the direction, great flexibility in time and place. You can work with any national or international brands and climb the professional ladder. You can also work in popular beauty salons, spas, clinics. This profession is one that gives you the opportunity to become your own boss or become a successful entrepreneur and salon owner.

People in the UK spent £8.6 billion at hairdressers and personal care salons in 2019. Each person spent an equivalent of £166 on personal care treatments yearly.

582 small and medium beauty care enterprises operated in the UK in 2020.

In 2020, the UK hairdressing, barbering and beauty industry had more than 288,000 employees

As of 2020, the UK's beauty industry worth is £27 billion and ranks as the seventh-largest global cosmetics market in the world. It holds the third spot for largest markets operating in the UK.

In 2019, 94% of people who worked in the beauty industry were female. In 2020, 65% of beauty workers were self-employed, a 57% growth from 2019

A reported 432% spike in bookings at the end of lockdown in April 2021 (while not entirely unexpected) indicates the future is bright.

Over half of hair and beauty businesses have an annual turnover of less than £99k.

SPORT & ACTIVE LEISURE

Skills and Expectations

The active roles in this sector will require good fitness levels and will at times also require a swim test to be completed. Having a positive attitude is needed for all the roles included in this sector. Being able to follow instructions and communicate well will be essential.

Sports Assistant - Placements Available - High Demand

Possible tasks:

- Working with a coach at various locations
- General administration and reception work
- Assisting with planning of training and sport programmes
- Assisting with training sessions
- Assisting the staff and observing them at work
- Working with groups of children

- Shadowing pool attendant
- Possible reception work
- Cleaning and tidying
- General maintenance of equipment
- Assisting with the running and development of the centre
- Assisting with group activities
- Researching, preparing and planning activities

Compulsory swim test for leisure placements

- 1.Swim 25 metres Head up
- 2. Swim 25 metres Life saving backstroke (arms may be used underwater to assist)
- 3. Raise alarm:
 - -Enter water safely
 - -Surface dive to deepest part of the pool
 - -Collect object
 - -Bring object to surface
 - -Tow object to side of pool
 - -Land object on to the poolside

The assessor will teach the student how to safely complete a reaching and a throwing rescue, using equipment on the poolside.

The student will then practice the two rescues and demonstrate they have understood and can use the procedures correctly.

Leicester and Leicestershire is home to a vibrant and fast-growing sports and physical activity sector, with research driven expertise, and globally recognised sports teams, athletes and facilities. The area 14 major sporting venues/clubs hosting national and international events, including Leicester City Football Club, Leicester Tigers, Leicester Riders, Leicester Hockey Club plus motor racing at Donington Park and Mallory Park, and horse racing at Leicester Racecourse. Prior to Covid, the sector (16,900 jobs) comprised mainly of sports and fitness facilities, sports clubs, manufacturing and the sale/rental of sports equipment, but there is now a growing range of online and virtual reality sports activities. The interest in health, wellness, fitness wearables or fitness apps, weight management and cycling are all likely to increase some demand within the sector and the requirement for digital skills is growing.

The sector provides a range of 'first jobs' for young people in leisure centres, sport and fitness clubs, as well as through hospitality and events at venues.

How we shop changes constantly, and retail is a fast-moving industry as organisations try to respond to - and predict - customer demand and future trends. Technological adaptation that would normally have taken years occurred during the Covid-19 pandemic in a matter of months. Online shopping was accelerated by lockdowns, with some areas booming, like purchases of food, cleaning products, pet products, gym equipment, home office and home furnishings; but other areas like work clothing declining in sales. This sector welcomes young people, who can then progress through on-the-job training or apprenticeships. Some students combine study with part-time work in areas like supermarket retail. Employing 46,615, retail is a significant sector here with large shopping centres, smaller boutique areas like St Martins and market towns with attractive shopping offers.

Retail roles include sales, customer service and behind-the-scenes jobs such as buying, merchandising, stock control, logistics, accountancy, store operations and identifying trends. Customer service, marketing and management skills are useful.

Next, Joules, Topps Tiles, Watches of Switzerland and Dunelm have their headquarters here.

Many store based independent shops have adapted to sell online and offer personal delivery services.

Supermarkets offer a wide range of roles and there are options to progress to management.

With online competition, physical stores are looking at ways to enhance in-store shopping with additional facilities like cafes, beauty treatments, music events and family fun days.

Online shopping expansion means roles such as digital marketing, coding, website development, user experience, online security, cyber security, logistics technology and delivery are growing. Access to consumers and their data will be a big shaper of the future retail market, enabling more tailored services.

Many retailers have a Twitter feed posting vacancies. Roles may include weekend, shift or seasonal work; shops are often open seven days a week.

Fosse Shopping Park has expanded, increasing stores and food in 2021.

Growing numbers of new micro traders sell a wide range of products online or through 'pop-up' stores.

Rental of goods is increasing, in areas like fashion, furniture and white goods. There's a shift towards sustainability and the repair and refurbishment of goods will grow. Some consumers are also highly interested in the ethics and ethos of brands.

HOSPITALITY & CATERING



Skills and Expectations

Working in the hospitality sector often means having to work under pressure and work flexible hours. Job roles in this sector require you to be a neat and careful worker along with having a clean and tidy appearance. All of the roles will include learning about certain hygiene protocols and potentially learning about food storage and replenishing.

Housekeeping Assistant - Placements Available

Possible tasks:

- Servicing of bedrooms to a high standard (vacuuming, polishing & cleaning bathrooms)
- Replenishing food, drink and sundries in the rooms

Food and drink production is the largest manufacturing sector in the UK, and was vital in keeping the nation fed during lockdowns. From farm to fork, roles include product development, growing, processing, manufacturing, quality testing, package design, distribution and sales. In Leicestershire, food and drink businesses range from smaller handcrafted goods companies to large producers such as Mars, Walkers (PepsiCo) and Samworth Brothers. The ethnic diversity of the area is represented in the sector with a number of producers of spices, sauces and traditional Indian foods. Emerging trends include the increasing use of digital technologies –like using data analytics in forecasting demand and supply, and food processing technology. 43,900 are employed across 3,865 businesses in this sector locally.

There is a huge range of careers across the sector, with over 100 different job roles.

There is a growing market for healthier eating, vegetarian and vegan offers, so many producers are adapting their product range.

Jobs include product manager, quality technician, food technologist, process operative, production planner, environmental technologist, chocolatier, pastry chef, brewer, research and development and food scientist.

There is a growing artisan food market, focusing on hand-made and locally-sourced goods. Melton Mowbray, has a new Food Enterprise Centre, offering a free food science and technology advice service for food and drink manufacturing businesses.

Stilton Cheese and Melton Mowbray pork pies are internationally known, and Walkers Crisps, the most popular UK crisp brand, has the world's largest crisp factory in Beaumont Leys.

PepsiCo has a huge research and development centre in Leicester, with a focus on healthier snacks, making and testing prototype ingredients, flavours and products.

Leicestershire's Pukka Pies supplies over 35 million pies a year to fish and chip shops and football stadiums.

The construction industry is growing and can offer amazing career opportunities to develop and travel! Increased demand comes from the need for more housing, environmentally friendly construction, commercial buildings and improving infrastructure - due to population growth, increased economic activity, and meeting new regulations.

There are over 180 different roles, not just those on a building site! Lockdowns and increased working from home have led to a boom in home improvements, with extensions, home offices, and kitchen, bathroom and garden improvements. There will be a growth in large offices and empty retail space being converted into smaller units, or housing.



Employing 40,800 people locally, the sector has 5,675 construction employers here.



Skills across construction are in demand, including plumbers, managers, electricians, wood trades, roofers, ground workers, quantity surveyors, architects, 3D technicians, smart building technicians, crane operators, interior fit-out, painters and decorators, scaffolders, plasterers and bricklayers.



There are over 30 different apprenticeships in construction. Each job is different, with new challenges, and there is satisfaction in seeing the finished job, whether a bridge or building!



There can be a lot of travel, often working away, with early starts, but great opportunities to progress.



There are thousands of new houses being built across the city and county. Major builds like Mercia Park and the new Glen Parva Prison.



The need for technical, STEM-based skills is growing - with advanced, technology-led methods, machinery and materials, particularly low-carbon related; by 2024 a third of the workforce will need Level 4+ qualifications. However, there are good, well-paid opportunities for those without such qualifications, through vocational and technical training routes.

You will potentially be given the chance to carry out general maintenance of hardware and assist technicians and library staff.

According to Tech Nation's UK tech in 2020 review, just under three million people were employed in the UK's digital tech economy - an increase of 11% within two years. In addition, at the end of 2020, the UK Tech Ecosystem update - a Tech Nation report supported by the Department for Digital, Culture, Media & Sport and the Digital Economy Council - revealed that a tenth of all UK job vacancies are tech roles. Your future IT job may involve creating applications or systems, solving problems with technology or supporting those who use it. Employers in the IT industry also require graduates to work in their business, marketing, human resources (HR) and finance functions. Many IT professionals also choose to work outside the sector, such as in the IT departments of retail, finance, manufacturing and public sector organisations.

The creative sector is about creating original ideas and products and is often split into three distinct parts: arts, culture and creative media. Job areas include design, film and video, social media, advertising, music, crafts, photography, computer games and animation, plus museums, galleries and performing arts. Digital skills are in demand, as technology is revolutionising how we live and work, and all organisations use IT in some way. The digital sector includes the manufacture of computers and digital goods; data processing, programming and hosting; tech consultancy and support (including cybersecurity) and commercial and domestic-use software. Locally there are 21,300 people employed in the creative sector and 17,800 employed in the digital sector.

The Cultural Quarter in Leicester is home to many creative businesses at the LCB Depot (which provides workspace for creative businesses), Curve, Makers Yard and Phoenix Square.

Creative centres in the county include the Ferrers at Staunton Harold, the Atkins Building in Hinckley, Charnwood Arts and Melton Space.

Job competition in the creative sector is high. You need to be tenacious with strong business and networking skills.

Many businesses across sectors invested in digital systems during lockdowns, using technology to offer an online presence.

Programmers and software development professionals feature in the top five* most advertised jobs locally.

Software company The Access Group has a new headquarters in Loughborough, creating up to 500 jobs.

Creative and Digital entry level roles include marketing assistant, apprentice light technician, apprentice animator, IT assistant, helpdesk analyst apprentice, business and administration roles.

If you have a real interest in people and their health and care these roles might be the best choices for you. You may be given a uniform or an overall. Teamwork skills and good communication skills are important in these roles because of the tasks involved. Your customer service skills will be greatly needed when speaking to customers and clients.

If you're passionate about helping people and making a difference in their lives, working in health care can be one of the most rewarding career choices there is. Health is about the treatment, control or prevention of disease, illness, injury or disability, either in hospitals, health centres or the community. If you're looking for an interesting career with lots of opportunities to progress, then health is for you. With over 350 job roles, you could work in the NHS, a charity or a partnership between the NHS and a local authority department, such as children's services. There are a wide range of roles in private healthcare too. There are roles based in nursing, specialist consultancy, pharmacy, therapeutic roles or scientific roles in laboratories. There are support roles too, in administration, finance, communication, security and maintenance.

People are living longer and the population is growing; 33,635 are employed in health locally. The NHS advertises the most job vacancies locally.

Skills shortages include midwives, A & E doctors, GPs, psychiatrists, nurses, occupational therapists etc

The heart centre at the Glenfield hospital is a leader in innovative research and techniques, such as surgery with a Robotic Arm.

Skills needs vary, from highly-technical, STEM-based skills for advanced, technology-led diagnosis and treatments – as well as softer, social and care-oriented skills – to support an ageing population. The need to support mental health is also growing.

Nursing is the number one health vacancy locally, and is a really employable degree, with 94% of graduates in work within 6 months; UK qualifications are internationally recognised.

Routes into health careers are expanding, with growing numbers of apprenticeships available from level 2 to degree level.

There are roles into health at all levels: Domestic and portering roles may require few or no qualifications. Administration, patient services, and HR roles may need GCSEs or higher. Scientific, technical and clinical roles need higher skills.
